

The Role and Expectations of the Class Captains

The **role of a class captain** is one of *privilege, pride, and responsibility*. They are more than just a title and badge and require dedication and commitment for an entire year. Each Captain will contribute an assortment of skills and ideas to the role.

Characteristics of a class captain:

- Polite and well-mannered.
- Organised, driven, and committed.
- Well-presented.
- Exemplary attendance.
- Able to liaise and converse with staff, students, and the wider community.
- Desire to act responsibly and to be a role model for other students.
- Follows the schools' Code of Behaviour.

You are expected to:

- To lead by example - always modelling appropriate behaviour.
- To report to the office if the Tutor or Teacher hasn't arrived to class.
- To encourage members of the class to keep the classroom tidy.
- To meet with the Tutor and Year Head to plan and organise events.
- To liaise with Mr. McKee to organise collections for fundraisers.
- To communicate any class concerns to the Tutor and Year Head.

We expect you to:

- be a positive role model and ambassador for the school.
- be enthusiastic and committed to the school ethos.
- be friendly and positive to ALL students.
- be responsible and trustworthy.
- be able to meet deadlines and have a good work ethic.

To apply to be a Class Captain: PROCEDURE:

1. Monday: Tutor outlines role of Class Captain.
2. Tuesday: Tutor takes nominations for Class Captain.
3. Wednesday: Nominees present a 1min long speech explaining why they would make a great Class Captain.
4. Thursday: Voting takes place after all the applications have given their speeches.
5. Friday: Report results to the Year Head

NOTE: Depending on the number of applicants voting may take place on Friday.
